

We John Allman of Eyrecourt and John Connolly of Cargen in the County of Galway Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the Establisshing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killeely in the County of Galway do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the Said Parish is One Hundred and Twenty Six pounds Sterling by the Year of which Sum of One Hundred and Twenty Six pounds, Forty two pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Rev John Bushe as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Vicar of Said Parish and his Successors, Fifty pounds Sterling are due and payable to John Bushe as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Parson of Said Parish and his Successors, Twenty five pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of Clonfert and Kilmacaugh and his Successors, Twenty three pounds Sterling are due and payable to Robert King as archdeacon of Kilmacaugh and his Successors - Six pounds Sterling are due and payable to the Rev Edward Hartigan as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Prebendary of Said Parish and his Successors.

We do further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in Such County for the period of Seven years, ending on the 1st day of November 1821 is ten Shillings and Six pence by the Panel —
